

FROM FR. STEVE

Happy Easter Everyone,
I feel blessed with the Grace of Easter and the sunshine and budding life of Spring among us. I hope you had a fruitful Lenten journey and are experiencing the New Life of the Resurrection of our Holy Redeemer Jesus Christ.

Today I want to give you the best information we have to date regarding the demolition



of the Large School and the Old Convent. I know there is a lot of emotion connected

with our school building—especially among those who have attended Holy Redeemer School and those who have sent their children here too. But when we show parishioners the enormous cost to maintain the school and the convent and the even larger costs which will continue to be attached to the school and convent everyone has agreed, that with a certain sadness, it is time to take these large buildings down.

The bright side is the vision we have for Holy Redeemer and the bright future we have for the wonderful and growing work God is doing among us here at our Holy Redeemer Community. We have a Vibrant Parish full of Life, Spirit, and Good Works. We are truly blessed.

Here is what we know so far regarding the demolition of the Large School and Convent:

- We do not have dates or timeline for demolition right now.
- We have talked to the diocese to begin the process which is long and slow.
- The Diocese of Lansing will cover all the costs of demolition, from start to finish.
- We will retain the Small School and use it for all the things we did in the Large School. We will no longer rent the small school but the money we will save from the other buildings still gives us a net gain of hundreds of thousands of dollars over just a few years..



- **We imagine** based on conversations with the Diocese of Lansing that they will begin the preparation work (which is significant) this year. That **is not guaranteed or set in stone** but is what we have been talking with the Diocese.

We imagine based on conversation with the Diocese of Lansing that actual demolition will begin no sooner than the Spring of **2019**. THAT IS NOT THIS SPRING. The Large School and Convent will NOT be demolished this year. This too, **is not guaranteed or set in stone** but is what our conversation with the Diocese of Lansing has been looking like so far.


- These conversations have been happening for more than a year in Parish Council and Finance Council and all decisions have had a full consensus and have been completely unanimous.
- We have had suggestions about selling the bricks to all who would want one for a certain amount as a fund raiser. We will pursue this further.
- We have had a suggestion of an open house for people to have a chance to say good-bye. We will look at this further.
- Remember, we do not have dates or timelines for anything right now. But we will keep you posted when we do.

That is what we know so far. When we have dates or timelines we will share them with you. If you have any questions at all please contact myself, or Ken Jubar, or Paul Schlegelmilch. We are happy to hear your suggestions and provide you with good information as we have it. For everything there is a time and a season. By all standards we are a Humble, Happy, Holy, and Healthy Parish. We are moving forward with God's Grace and believe God has a wonderful vision for our future.
