In many Catholic countries, Rita came to
be known to be as the patroness of

was meditating before an image of Christ crucified,
as she was long accustomed to doing. Suddenly a
small wound appeared on her forehead, as though
a thorn from the crown that encircled Christ's head
had loosed itself and penetrated her own flesh. For
the next fifteen years she bore this external sign of
stigmatization and union with the Lord.

St. Bede wrote the history of the Christian Churches
in England, and of England generally; its main focus

the most important original references on Anglo-
Saxon history.



Gregory is perhaps best known for the
part he played in the Investiture
Controversy, his dispute with Henry IV,
Holy Roman Emperor that affirmed the
primacy of papal authority and the new
canon law governing the election of
the pope by the College of Cardinals.



Mary Magdalene de' Pazzi, O.Carm.
was an Italian Carmelite nun and
mystic. She was affectionately known
as "The Passion Flower of the
Eucharist." St. Mary Magdalene was taught mental
prayer, also known as meditation, at the tender age
of nine, at the request of her mother.

Witness to HOPE

HAPPY PENTECOST TO ALL THE WONDERFUL PARISHIONERS OF HOLY REDEEMER!

I wanted to take this opportunity to give you some good feedback on the Witness to Hope Campaign that the Diocese ran last year. We reached our goal in pledges of over \$1,100,000. I think it really helped that we could pay it over 5 years. I made another payment this month and should be able to pay off my pledge by next year. God bless you in your faithful support of the Bishop and the good work he is doing.

Some of our parishioners have asked about the share of the money pledged to the Witness to Hope Campaign that was supposed to come back to Holy Redeemer. So I will update you all on that today.

As of today, the share of the money that has come back to us from our Parishioners who have paid on their pledge is \$116,000. That money is being banked by the Diocese of Lansing for us and is available to use right now.

Probably the first project we will complete is putting a new roof on the Family Life Center. What a blessing that these funds are available to us right now exactly when we need them. This roof will probably cost less than \$70,000. This will leave us approximately \$50,000 in the bank for our next project.

The second project in my mind that we need to do very soon is the wall of the Church which is on the Southwest side (the wall with the large yellow Chi Rho Window above the wing by the Music ministry). The building committee, the Diocesan property manager, Alan Olsen, and our Finance Council have identified replacing this outside brick wall as critical and must be done soon. This will cost more than \$50,000 so we will do it as soon as the extra needed funds are in the bank.

This is where we currently stand and we will keep you posted as the funds continue to collect. I would be happy to answer any questions or contact our Business Manager Ken Jubar at the office.

Thank you for your timely generosity and loving support of our Bishop and our Parish.

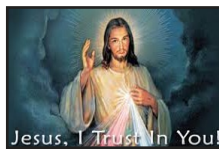

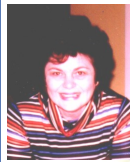
