Wednesday **The Most Holy Name of Mary**

The name of Mary is venerated because it belongs to the Mother of God. In 1684, Pope Innocent XI included it in the General Roman Calendar to commemorate the victory at the Battle of Vienna in 1683. It was removed from the Church calendar in the liturgical reform following Vatican II but restored by Pope Saint John Paul II in 2002, along with the Feast of the Holy Name of Jesus

Thursday **John Chrysostom, Bishop & Church Doctor**



1 Cor 8:1b-7, 11-13;
Ps 139:1b-3, 13-14ab, 23-24;
Lk 6:27-38

He is known for his preaching and public speaking, his denunciation of abuse of authority by both ecclesiastical and political leaders. Chrysostom was among the most prolific authors in the early Christian Church, exceeded only by Augustine of Hippo in the quantity of his surviving writings.¹

Friday **Exaltation of the Holy Cross**



Nm 21:4b-9;
Ps 78:1bc-2, 34-35, 36-37, 38;
Phil 2:6-11; Jn 3:13-17

The date of the feast marks the dedication of the Church of the Holy Sepulchre in 335.¹² This was a two-day festival: although the actual consecration of the church was on September 13, the cross itself was brought outside the church on September 14 so that the clergy and faithful could pray before the True Cross, and all could come forward to venerate it.

Saturday **Our Lady of Sorrows**

Name by which the Virgin Mary is referred to in relation to sorrows in her life. As *Mater Dolorosa*. In common religious Catholic imagery, the Virgin Mary is portrayed in a sorrowful and lacrimating affect, with seven long knives or daggers piercing her heart, often bleeding

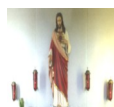

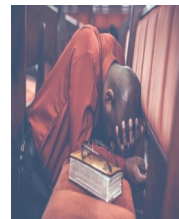
